Because of public health concerns arising from the COVID-19 (coronavirus) pandemic and the State of Emergency declared by *I Maga' Hågan Guåhan* in Executive Order No. 2020-03 on March 14, 2020, the court, in accordance with its jurisdiction to issue orders in aid of its supervisory jurisdiction over the Superior Court of Guam and all other courts of the judicial branch of Guam, issues this **ORDER** regarding access to the facilities of the Judiciary of Guam to protect the public health by reducing the risk of exposure to the coronavirus and slowing the spread of the disease:

- 1. Effective immediately, the following persons shall not enter the Guam Judicial Center in Hagåtña, the Northern Court Satellite in Dededo, or any Judiciary of Guam facility, including but not limited to probation offices and the Judicial Education Center:
 - a. Persons who have been diagnosed with or have had contact with anyone who has been diagnosed with COVID-19.
 - b. Persons with any acute respiratory illness symptoms (i.e, cough, shortness of breath, headaches) flu-like symptoms, fever, or sneezing.
 - c. Persons who have been asked to self-quarantine by any doctor, hospital, board of health, or other medical provider or health agency, or who reside with anyone who has been asked to self-quarantine.

- d. Persons who have been in China, Iran, South Korea, the United Kingdom, Ireland, or the Schengen Area European Countries¹ within the last fourteen (14) days. This list may be updated as further guidance is received.
- e. Persons who reside or have had close contact with someone who has traveled to these countries in the last fourteen (14) days.
- 2. Anyone attempting to enter in violation of this Order will be denied entry by Judiciary marshals, probation officers or other security personnel.
- 3. If you have scheduled appearances or appointments at the Judiciary of Guam or any of its offices or facilities and you fall into any of the above-listed categories, you should proceed as follows:
 - a. If you are represented by an attorney, please contact your attorney.
 - b. If you have no attorney and are seeking emergency relief, please call the Clerk's Office of the court in which you are seeking relief.
 - c. If you are an attorney scheduled to appear before a judge, please contact that section or team directly by telephone.
 - d. If you are scheduled to meet with a probation officer, please contact the probation officer or applicable probation section directly by telephone.
 - e. If you are a juror sitting on an ongoing trial or grand jury, please call the telephone number you were provided with when you were seated on the jury.
 - f. If in doubt as to whom you should contact, please call the Clerk's Office of the court in which you were scheduled to appear.
- 4. These restrictions are temporary but will remain in place until it is determined to be safe to remove them upon further order of the Court. The court, in a separate order to follow, will address the effect of the fourteen-day closure of the

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Because of public health concerns arising from the COVID-19 (coronavirus) pandemic and the State of Emergency declared by *I Maga' Hågan Guåhan* in Executive Order No. 2020-03 on March 14, 2020, the court, in accordance with its jurisdiction to issue orders necessary for the supervision of the judicial branch of Guam and to make rules governing the practice and procedure in the courts of Guam, issues this **ORDER** to protect the public health by reducing the risk of exposure to the coronavirus and slowing the spread of the disease:

- 1. Except as provided herein, all jury trials, in both civil cases and criminal cases, scheduled to commence in the Superior Court of Guam between the date of this order and April 17, 2020, are continued to a date no earlier than April 21, 2020. This Order does not affect any case in which a jury has been empaneled or where a jury has been selected for empanelment, which cases shall proceed to verdict.
- 2. Upon showing exceptional circumstances, any criminal defendant whose trial is postponed by this Order may seek an exception to this Order by motion directed to the trial court. No exception shall be granted except with approval of the judge presiding over the cause and the Presiding Judge, after consultation with the jury commissioner.
- 3. The continuances occasioned by this Order serve the ends of justice and outweigh the best interest of the public and the defendant in a speedy trial. Therefore, the time periods of such continuances shall be excluded from speedy trial computations under 8 GCA § 80.60.

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- 4. Where a jury trial is postponed because of this Order, the parties may seek a conference with the court to address matters arising from the postponement. Such conference should be conducted by teleconference or videoconference, where practicable. In criminal cases, where appropriate, a defendant may ask the court for reconsideration of bail or conditions of release. Nothing in this Order addresses the disposition of such requests for reconsideration.
- 5. No new grand juries shall be empaneled between the date of this Order and April 21, 2020. Grand juries whose terms expire on or before April 21, 2020, shall be extended until that date. No orientation of new jurors shall take place between the date of this Order and April 21, 2020. All active petit jurors shall serve to the full extent of the law.
- 6. The court may issue further orders regarding this matter as necessary to address the evolving circumstances arising from this pandemic.
